Costs

Behaviour Policy

We want you to enjoy your time with us and to feel safe and welcome at PYT. To help you get the most from your experience, we have some expectations of your behaviour and promises about what you can expect from us.

What you can expect from us

- To be treated with respect.
- To help you, answer your questions, and provide support when needed.
- To listen to you.
- To share and celebrate your commitment and enthusiasm.

What we expect from you

- To treat our staff and other PYT members with respect.
- To be on time, or let us know if you are running late.
- To engage with us and the activities we offer.
- To try your hardest.

Behaviour Policy

What you should not tolerate

- Being bullied.
- Being threatened or being made to do something you do not want to do.

If either of these happen, please talk to someone in the Take Part team. We can't promise to keep all of your problems secret as sometimes we might have to inform someone else, but we will do our best to respect your confidence.

What we will not tolerate

- Aggressive, threatening, or bullying behaviour.
- Violence of any kind.
- Being in possession of or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Vandalism.
- Stealing.

Attendance Policy

Being in a session

The Palace Youth Theatre is for people who are keen to develop their interest in drama and performance and to have fun. Our facilitators plan each session in advance for the term. Unexpected absences make planning difficult.

1. If you have to miss a session we expect you to email us, preferably in advance. This means we will not worry about you and can plan a session around your absence.
2. If your attendance proves to be unreliable over more than one session (this includes persistent lateness or late pick ups), the staff may use their discretion to remove you from the group and offer your place to someone else on the waiting list.
3. We regret that no payments or fees can be returned once the term has begun.

Before committing to the term, you and your parents should weigh up how much time you need for your studies, your job, your family and social life, and then decide if you really can make the commitment.

Behaviour Policy Procedures

We want everyone in PYT to feel respected, safe, and valued where everyone is supportive and kind to one another. Where behaviour falls short of the standards expected, we will take the following action:

Minor or first-time incidents

For minor or first-time incidents, our staff or volunteers will remind you about the expectations we have of each other and ask you to change your behaviour. This gives you the chance to think and to plan how you could behave differently, with support from staff and/or volunteers.

More serious or further incidents

If your behaviour is more serious or does not improve, you will be given a formal warning by the facilitator running your activity. You may also be asked to sit out of the activity until it is safe for you to resume. The facilitator will make a record about what happened and inform your parents or carers if it is appropriate. They will also talk with you about what happened and agree what support you need to improve your behaviour in the future. We might also decide to take further steps, such as restricting you from taking part in some activities.

Major incidents or persistent bad behaviour

If the support we have put in place isn't helping you to change your behaviour or there is a major breach of our behaviour policy, we might need to give you a final warning. Again, this will be recorded and we'll inform your parent(s)/carer(s) as appropriate.

At this point, we might need to discuss other services that might be better able to give you the support you need.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need any experience?

No! You simply need to have an interest in theatre and drama.

Where do the sessions take place?

Sessions take place in the Rehearsal Studio at Watford Palace Theatre, however, there may be times when sessions will be off-site.

How do I stay informed?

Once you have received your membership pack you are officially a member of the Palace Youth Theatre. You will be kept on our database and will always be informed. Remember to keep your contact details up to date!

Should I bring anything?

You should wear comfy clothing, and as each session usually has a short break, bring a drink and a snack. (PLEASE NO SNACKS WITH NUTS)

Where do I sign up?

To sign up to the PYT, email us on takepart@watfordpalacetheatre.co.uk, and we will invite you to a taster session.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do the taster sessions work?

It is simply a regular PYT session that you can attend to help you decide if you like the class before committing to paying the term's fees. Once signed up for a taster session, you should fill in and send us a membership and photo consent form at least 24 hours in advance.

How does the waiting list work?

If any of our groups are full, we'll add you to a waiting list. We'll contact you by email or phone, inviting you to a taster session as soon as a place becomes available.

What happens when I am too old for PYT?

There are plenty of opportunities at Watford Palace Theatre after you turn 16 years old. You will be able to apply to join our Palace Young Company or take part in other events for young people 16+ like Hertfordshire Film Festival.

Do you give us information regarding auditions for theatre, film and TV or other opportunities?

Organisations sometimes email us about exciting opportunities they have, which we may decide to pass on to relevant groups. These opportunities will not necessarily be endorsed by WPT and we advise you to do your own research before applying.

Frequently Asked Questions

My child behaves much older/younger than their age, can they go into a different group?

We recommend your young person stays in a group with others their own age. However, our groups all overlap by one year to allow for a small amount of flexibility when wanting to stay in a group with friends.

What is Hertfordshire Film Festival?

Hertfordshire Film Festival is an annual opportunity to create a film and see it showcased on the big screen at Watford Palace Theatre, alongside talks with leading film and TV industry experts for ages 11-17 and 18-25. <https://www.hertsfilmfest.co.uk/>

What if I cannot afford the PYT fee?
